

HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

The Historic Preservation Commission is an advisory body to the City Council. It is composed of five (5) members appointed by the Mayor and City Council. Each Councilmember nominates one member and the Mayor nominates two members.

LEGAL AUTHORITY: Municipal Code Section 15.72.040

TERM: (3) years. Appointments are made in March.

QUALIFICATIONS: Members must be residents of the City throughout their term.

DUTIES: The Historic Preservation Commission reviews applications for Cultural Resource designations and historic districts; presides and conducts public hearings on such applications and makes recommendations to the City Council. Additionally, the Commission reviews and comments on applications as may be referred to the Commission by the Planning Commission, Board of Zoning Adjustment or the City Council.

MEETINGS: Meetings are held on the third Tuesday of each month at 4:00 p.m. in the Kress Building Third Floor Conference Room, 19th and K Streets.
