Wednesday, December 7, 2016 at 0752 hours (7:52 a.m. PST) a reinforced alarm from the Bakersfield Fire Department responded to a reported two-story, multi-family residential structure fire at 120 N Street including 5 Engines, 2 Trucks, 2 Battalion Commanders, 2 Arson Units, 1 Safety Officer, 1 Info Officer, 1 Fire Prevention Officer, 2 Command Staff Officers, and assisting agencies (BPD, COB Building Dept.).

First arriving BFD Fire Prevention Units reported a "working fire" in a *vacant* duplex type structure with heavy fire showing from the second story. BFD Engine Company Firefighters arrived on scene and immediately deployed multiple hoselines to the interior of the second story apartment, where they were met by heavy fire and heat conditions. Additional BFD Firefighters established hydrant-based water supplies, and assisted with the interior firefighting. BFD Truck Company Firefighters simultaneously provided vertical "roof-side" ventilation to assist with interior crews advancement on the blaze, and checked for fire extension.

BFD Arson Investigators are currently determining the cause of the fire. Damage estimated at \$85,000. No civilian or Firefighter injuries were reported.
