PLAYING RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The team listed second is the home team.
2. Games will be 1 hour long with no new inning started after 50 minutes. Once an inning is started, it shall be played to completion.
3. Amateur Softball Association (ASA) rules apply with modifications by the Department to provide the most suitable program.
4. All players' names and their signature must be on the roster/waiver before they can participate in a game.
5. Players participating in the City of Bakersfield Recreation and Parks Adaptive Softball Program are not covered in any way for accident insurance or medical payments in any form.
6. A plate extension will be utilized during games. Players running from 3rd base to home plate may touch the orange extension or white home plate in order to avoid a collision.

7. If the batter is unable to run the bases, a courtesy runner is permitted. The runner will be designated by the team manager. The use of this runner does not affect the playing status of the batter.
8. There is an anti-collision rule. If the runner does not attempt to get around the fielder, the ball is dead. The runner or the batter shall be called out due to the interference.
9. There are no position restrictions on any players. A team has the option of batting their entire roster of any number of players. This must be decided at the beginning of the game.
10. If possible, batting order must alternate male-female; two women may bat back to back, but never two males.
11. Line-ups shall be turned into the umpire 10 minutes before the game time. Each team must fill out the score card. Umpires have the official time clock and are in charge of the game.
12. Base runners can't leave the base until a player hits the ball. No lead offs. Every batter/runner must wear a helmet.
13. If there are questions on the field conditions due to inclement weather, contact the Department.
14. No metal cleats, open toe shoes, or sandals allowed.
15. Game softballs, bats, gloves, and helmets will be provided by the Recreation and Parks Department.
16. Players and coaches must exhibit sportsmanship and fair play.
17. Instead of the Run Rule, once a team bats all their players in one inning, the other team bats.
